Vision Statement

Our beliefs:

Our Teaching Philosophy:

As teachers, we believe encouraging a *Spiritual Faith (Wairuatanga)* is a crucial part of the holistic development of children – *learning to be healthy in mind, body and spirit.* We believe in order for children to learn their mana must be uplifted. *One's Place and Belonging, (turangawaewae) building identity and independence, where tamariki feel empowered and connected.*

We model *Respect for one another (Whānaungatanga, Manaakitanga)*, by upholding the Fruits of the Spirit in our teaching.(these are the core values of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control) We welcome all.

We believe that *Children are unique and they come with their own competence (Mōhiotanga)*, whakapapa, and seeds of greatness within them. Their individual personality traits enhance the richness and diversity of our Preschool, and offer opportunities for tamariki to extend their compassion for each other.

We are *Intentional teachers*, who aim to nurture genuine relationships built on trust, ensuring each child receives our 1:1 attention. We are *Kaitiakitanga -Guardians* embracing & learning from the local beach environment.

We are committed to being of **Service- to our whanau, children and each other**, modelling these values to our tamariki with opportunities for **Service Leadership (Tuakana-Teina)**, which develops agency, responsibility, connection and collaboration (**Mahi-Tahi**).

We are committed to honouring **Te Tiriti O Waitangi** and developing our bicultural journey, so that our tamariki can flourish as children of Aotearoa.
